This book is about Inklings.






How do I get help to fill out forms for Inklings?



Who is Inklings for?

Inklings is for babies who are 6 to 18 months old.

It is for babies who behave in some of the ways listed below.



• Your baby is **not** smiling back at you



 Your baby is **not** using eye contact to get your attention



Your baby is **not** responding to their name





Your baby is not copying your actions




 Your baby is **not** pointing to show you things








What is Inklings?







A caregiver is someone who looks after the baby.



The program has 10 sessions.



Each session is held every 2 weeks.

What is Inklings?

The steps of each session are listed below.



 A short video of you playing and communicating with your baby will be recorded

This video will be around 5 minutes long.



 You will watch this video with one of our practitioners



Our practitioners are workers who know a lot about how babies play and communicate.



 You will talk with our practitioner about how your baby plays and communicates in the video

This will help you to understand the different ways that your baby plays and communicates.



 You will learn how to play and communicate in ways that are best for your baby.



What is good about Inklings?

Inklings helps caregivers to understand the different ways that their baby plays and communicates.



They will learn how to play in ways that are best for their baby.



They will learn how to communicate in ways that are best for their baby.

This will help the caregiver and their baby to play and communicate in a fun way.



This will help their baby to learn how to communicate and be with others.



How long does Inklings take?

The program has 10 sessions.



Each session is 1 hour.



Each session is held every 2 weeks.



The program is done in 6 months.

Where is Inklings held?



Sessions can be held



• in 1 of our rooms



Our rooms are in different places around Perth and Western Australia.



• via telehealth

Telehealth is when you hold a session through a video call using a computer, tablet or phone.


A tablet is small, flat computer like an iPad.



• in your own home.

How much does Inklings cost?







Eligible means that you meet the rules for taking part in the program.




You can contact us to see if you are eligible to take part.




If you are eligible to take part you **will not** have to pay any money.

How do I know if my baby can take part?



Your baby must meet the rules for taking part in the program.



These rules include

 your baby must be between 6 and 18 months old at the start of the program



 families must live in Western Australia for the whole program.



You must also show that it would be good for your baby to take part in the program.



We will ask you some questions about your baby to work out if Inklings would be good for them.



How do I know if my baby can take part?

We will ask you these questions on a form.



Your answers will help us to work out if your baby might be slower or different to other babies in how they communicate and play.

The same caregiver **must** attend each session.



This person **must** be able to attend all of the sessions.



We think it is good if another person who looks after the baby can also come to the sessions.

What is the best way to attend the sessions?

It **does not** matter where you take part in the sessions.



The program is the same

• at an Inklings place



• via telehealth.



What happens at the end of the Inklings program?

We will work with you to decide what your baby should do next.



We will give you written information about

how your baby communicates and plays



 what we have agreed your baby should do next.
